- Grades will be posted to PowerSchool. I will do my best to post updates in a timely manner.
- Throughout the school year, you will be assessed according to the quality of your assignments and the growth of your understanding of the content. Accomplishing the required credit is essential for your learning experience. Extra credit opportunities are rare and will only be provided if required credit has been worked for. My grading system is as follows: 94-100 = A 90-93.9 = A-87-89.9 = B+83-86.9 = B 80-82.9 = B-77-79.9 = C+73-76.9 = C 70-72.9 = C-67-69.9 = D+63-66.9 = D 60-62.9 = D-

IV. Tardy/Attendance

- We will be following Timpview's new attendance policy. You are expected to be in your seat and starting on Bell Work when the bell rings. If you are not in the classroom at all when the bell rings you will be marked Tardy. You will NOT be allowed to make up work missed due to unexcused tardiness.
- If you are ever tardy or absent, it is your responsibility to find out what you missed and collect the necessary assignments. To find missed assignments, check the 'Absent Work Bin', the class website, and/or googleclassroom.com. If you have any questions I am happy to assist you.

V. Bathroom Passes/Leaving Class

You are expected to use the bathroom and take care of other errands before and after class. However, I
understand that emergencies happen. You may leave for important reasons as long as you ask for
permission at appropriate times and return in a timely manner.

VI. Late Work

- All work should be turned in on time, but I completely understand that emergencies happen and sometimes an extension is necessary. When this occurs I will accept late work without deducting points as long as you discuss the matter with me and we decide your new deadline. If it is not an emergency, you get <u>one</u> pass per term to turn late work in at the beginning of the <u>next class period</u> without points being deducted. If you have late work and your one pass has been used, you can turn it in at the beginning of the next class period and 10% will be deducted. After that the assignment will no longer be accepted. Assessments/in-class activities you miss have <u>one week</u> to be made up before receiving 'no credit.' <u>All late</u> work must be turned in with a 'Late Work Report' in the 'Late Work' basket.
- Exceptions may be made for certain cases.

• If you know you are going to be absent, come and talk to me as soon as you are aware. It is your responsibility to get as much of it done beforehand, rather than after you return. At the time you come to speak with me about your absence we will also decide an appropriate deadline for these assignments.

VII. Electronics

• Technology is a great tool that we will utilize often in the classroom. However, cell phones and other electronics (including earphones) should not be <u>seen or heard</u> unless they are being used for specific instructional purposes. The first infraction will result in your <u>only</u> warning. The second will result in the confiscation of the electronic, which will be kept in my classroom until you retrieve it at the end of the day. If it occurs again it will be given to the front office to take care of. <u>Refusal to hand over an electronic device will immediately result in detention and parents/guardians may be notified.</u>

VIII. Academic Integrity

• Students shall not misrepresent examination materials, writing, homework, or other assignments as their own when they are someone else's work. If cheating occurs, an automatic zero will replace any score, we will make a phone call home, and administration will be notified. Remember that aiding a cheater is also considered cheating. We will clearly define plagiarism in class.
